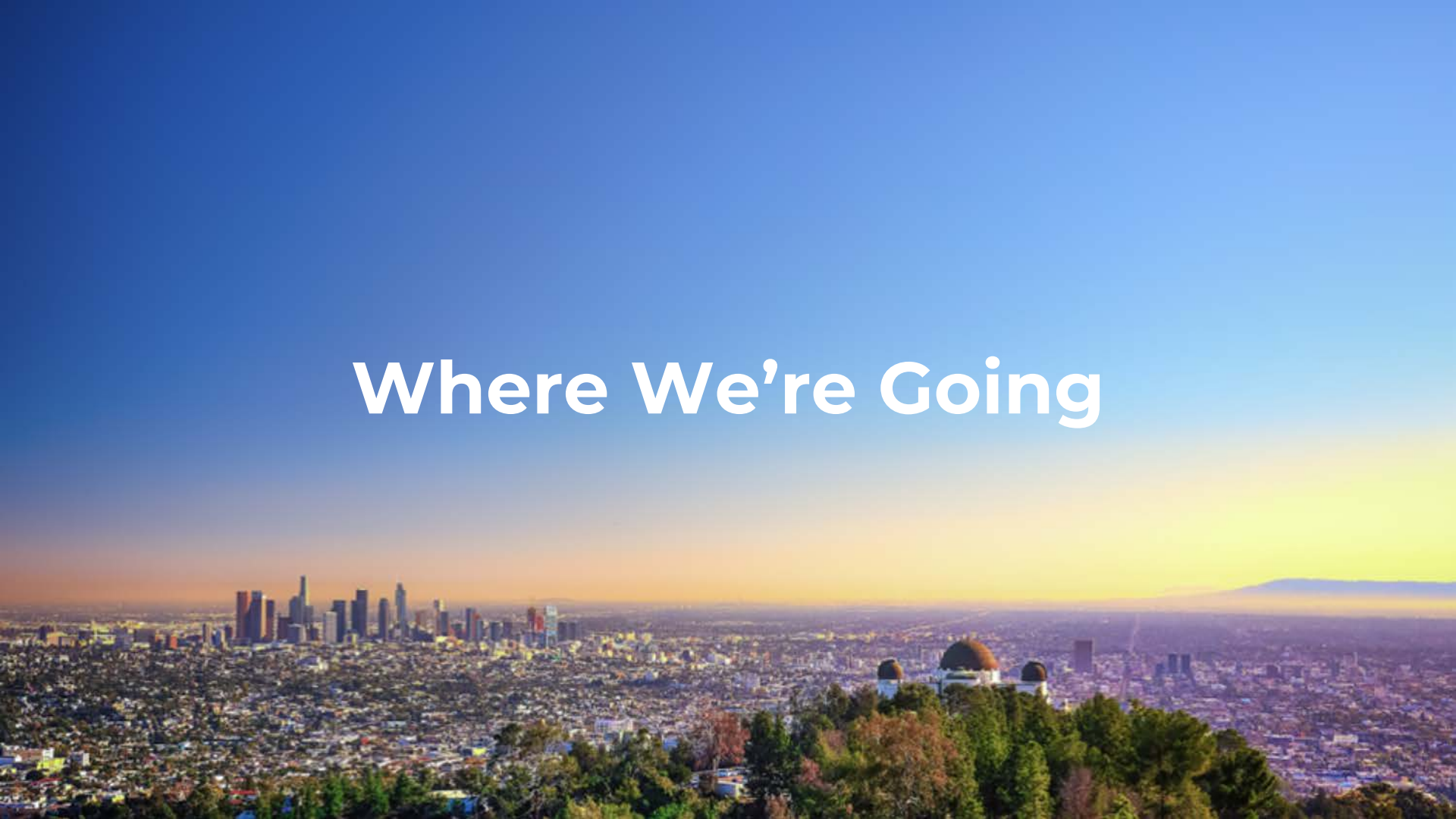

Infrastructure Goals

1

Improve City Services for All Angelenos by addressing service request backlogs, bolstering services in historically underserved areas, and enhancing customer satisfaction.

2

Fill City Vacancies and Bolster Pathways to Career Path Jobs by hosting career fairs in every Council district, expanding workforce training programs, and reducing onboarding times.

3

Reduce Traffic Fatalities and Champion Walking, Biking and Transit by delivering mobility and traffic safety improvements in line with Mobility 2035 and Community Safety.

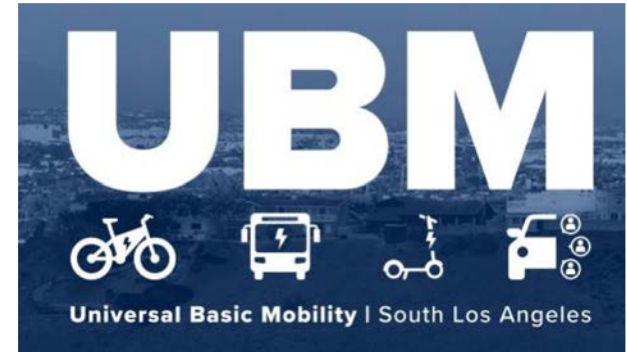
Establish a 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan Centered on Transparency, Accountability, and Equity by developing a Citywide vision for infrastructure, a transparent process for initiating, planning, and budgeting capital projects, and expanded opportunities for public participation and engagement.

Reduce Traffic Fatalities and Champion Walking, Biking and Transit

- **Align and coordinate public right-of-way investments** across City departments
- Invest in **street safety infrastructure** that saves lives
- Make transportation **safe, inviting, clean and comfortable**
- Prioritize **first and last-mile access** to transit so that all Angelenos can use the region's growing rail and bus network
- Create **family-friendly bicycle and pedestrian routes** to connect neighborhood destinations and transit stops

Universal Basic Mobility Pilot

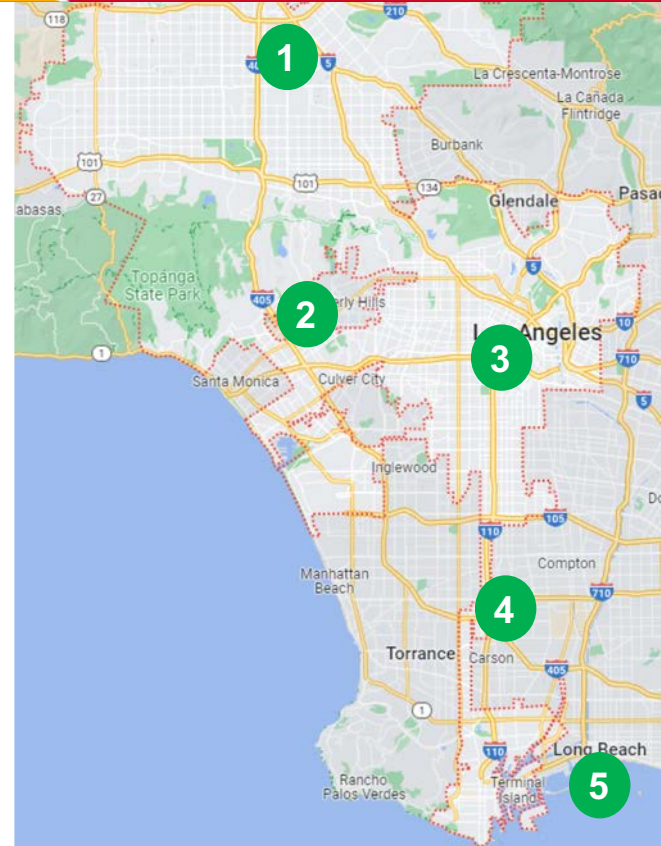
- Community-driven approach

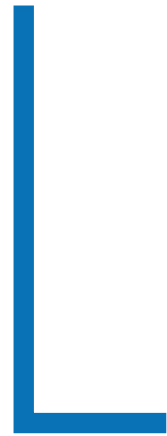
